





Assign ORCID iD



<p>Step 1: Link your ORCID iD to your ETH person profile</p>	
<p>To be able to assign your ORCID iD to publications in the Research Collection, you need to first link your ORCID record to your ETH profile.</p> <p>In order to do so, please log in to the Addresses and Personal Data application.</p>	
<p>In your profile, click on "link ORCID iD" and log into orcid.org. Agree to its import. The ORCID link will then be created automatically.</p> <p>If you do not have an ORCID iD yet, you can register on orcid.org for free in the same step ("link ORCID iD").</p>	
<p>Your ORCID iD will be displayed in your personal profile as well as in your public profile on ETH Zurich's People Search.</p>	



Your Research Collection user profile is updated over night. Therefore, once you have connected your ORCID iD to your ETH profile, you will need to wait for the next day in order to use the features described in steps 2 and 3 in the Research Collection.

<p>Step 2: Assign your ORCID iD to publications in the Research Collection</p>	
<p>Sign in to the Research Collection with your ETH user account.</p> <p>Click on "Assign ORCID iD" in the left hand navigation under the "Publish" heading.</p>
